



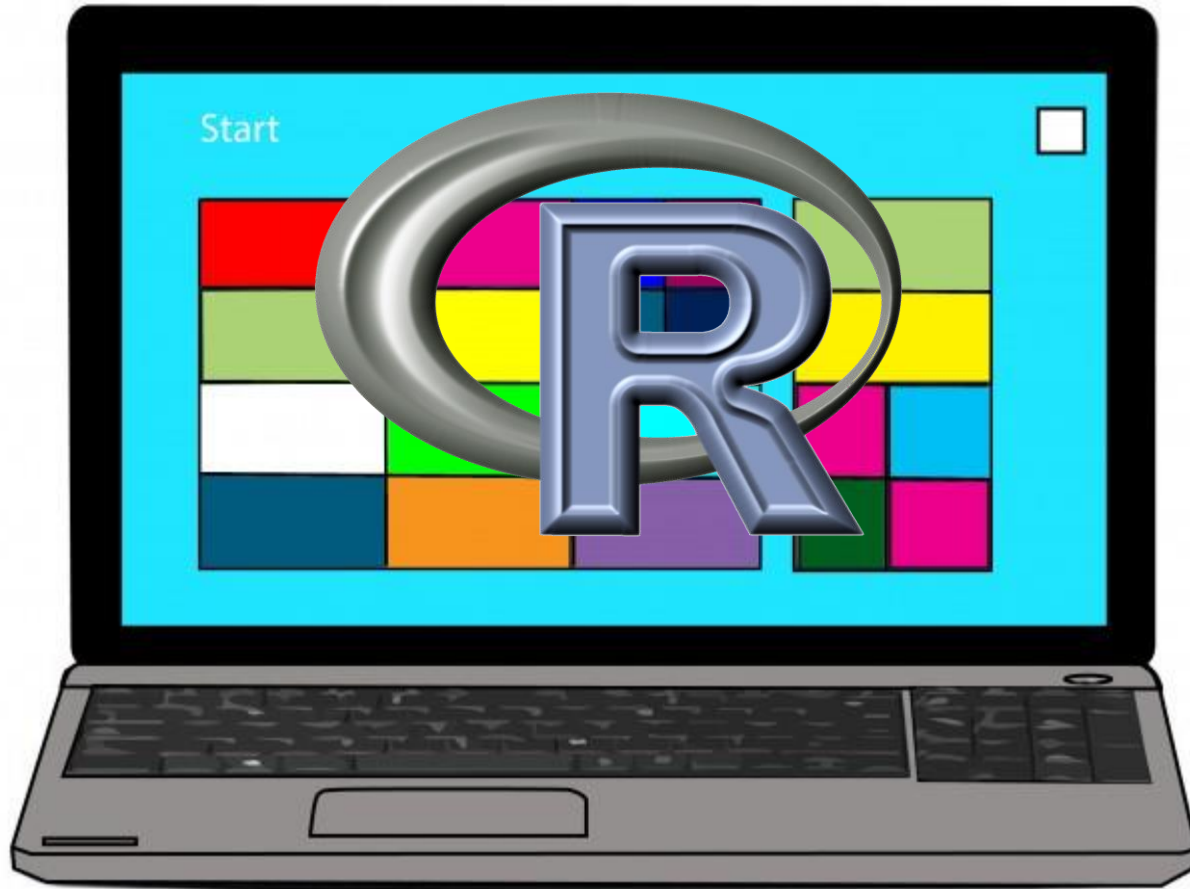

Functions and objects

The output of functions are most easily returned as a list.

```
list(name=value, ...)
```

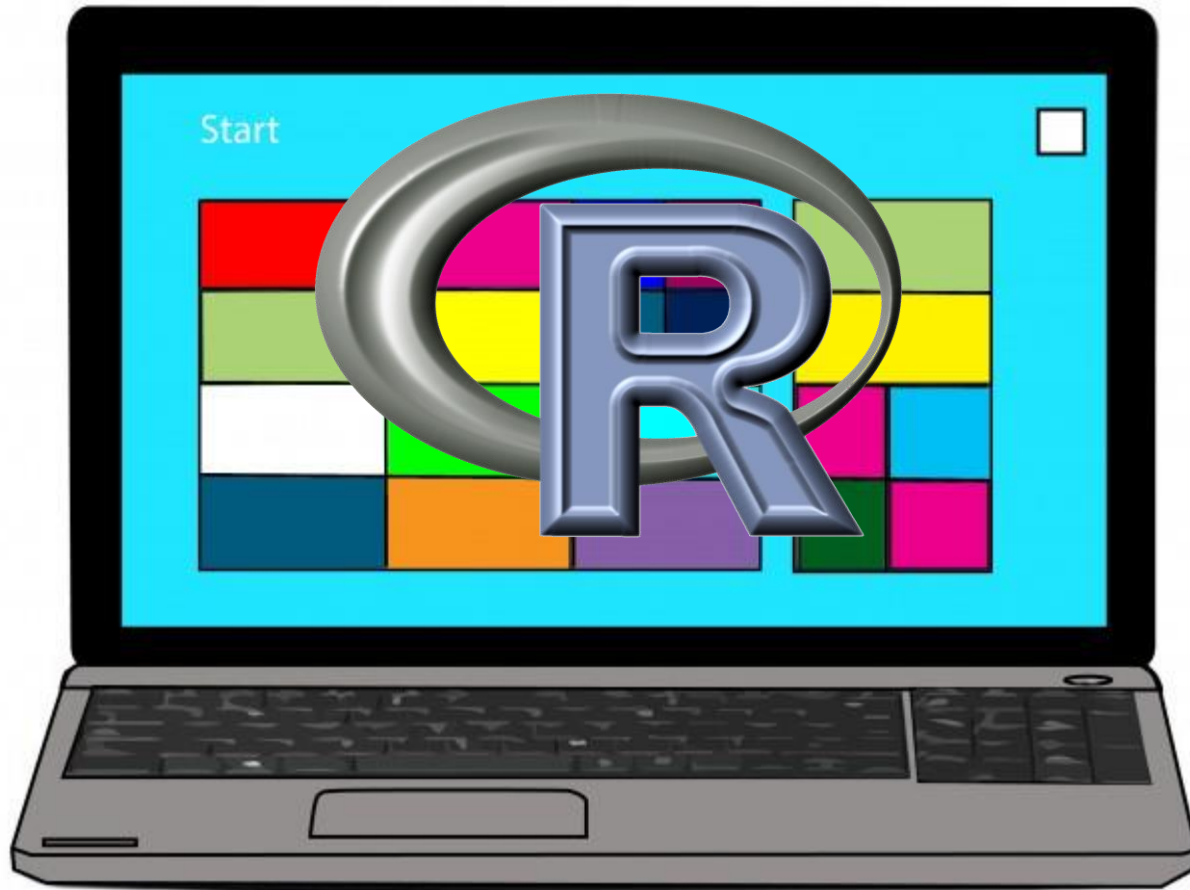
